James V. "Jim" Callahan, age 89, a resident of Lisle, IL, formerly of Wheaton and Glencoe, IL, passed away peacefully on Thursday, July 6, 2023, surrounded by his family at Brookdale of Lisle, IL. He was born on August 17, 1933, in Chicago, IL.

Jim followed in the footsteps of his beloved father and attended the University of Notre Dame where he earned his BS in Mechanical Engineering in 1955. If the team was not performing up to his standards, children, and those with sensitive ears, were well warned to steer clear.

Jim roomed with John McCall at Notre Dame, who, as kismet would have it, grew up with Nancy Sickels. Jim and Nancy met at John and Kathy McCall's wedding when lightning struck both. Jim and Nancy married on August 2, 1958, and remained utterly in love and devoted to each other for the rest of Jim's life.

Jim attended Loyola University School of Law and earned his JD and passed the bar in 1959, immediately following the birth of his first of six children, Maureen. Jim worked as a successful patent attorney for 56 years, earning the admiration of many colleagues and his family. Jim's daughter Kathleen decided to follow Jim's example by also becoming an attorney. Jim decided to retire at the young age of eighty.

Jim raised his family in Glencoe, IL and was a faithful member of Sacred Heart Catholic Church. Despite his busy legal career, Jim was an unusually involved Dad, especially for the 1960s and 1970s. Jim never balked at changing diapers, any form of childcare, was home for
