- I want to start off by saying...

Redundancies

Could potentially Completely overhaul **Necessarily** need Launch a new campaign Further expand Past history Prior experience Future plans/advance planning 10-year anniversary Added bonus Adequate enough

The CEO took the opportunity to delegate
The mayor decided to appoint
Within months they began posting videos

They finished the project

Within months they began posting videos Within months they posted videos

Make verb tenses do the work

He will retire later this year.

She was promoted earlier this month.

In these cases, "earlier" and "later" offer no additional information, just vagueness.

Seemingly
It would appear that

Might potentially
Could conceivably

Know what you want to say, and say it with assurance.

"In a nutshell..."
